

Federal support for Co-Response

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911 Community Crisis Responders Act

- Introduced in 2023 with Rep. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA)
- Creates a federal grant <u>program</u> that provides funds to:
 - Hire unarmed professional service providers and 911 dispatchers
 - Build capacity to coordinate health and social services & community-based organizations
 - Establish protocols on when mobile crisis responders should be deployed to scene
 - Coordinate response and dispatching between 911 and 988 entities



Other federal funding

- Congressman Smith appropriations requests:
 - \$10M for Crisis Response grants in the FY 2022 government funding bill--GRANTED
 - \$20M for Crisis Response grants in the FY 2023 government funding bill--GRANTED
 - \$100M requested in FY 2024 funding for co-response teams--PENDING
- How that translates to federal funding:
 - <u>SAMHSA</u> Cooperative Agreements for Innocative Community Crisis Response Partnerships
 - Partial CAHOOTS Act enactment -- enhanced FMAP for the first 3 years of crisis respose
 - Community Project Funding / Congressional Directed Spending <u>requests</u>
